Both males and females are at equal risk of HPV infection. HPV is so common that almost everyone who is sexually active will get HPV infection at some point in their lifetime. You are most likely to first encounter HPV in your late teens or early 20s. This is why the HPV vaccine is offered in school. **HPV** infection usually clears up by itself. When HPV infection doesn't clear up by itself, it may become a problem as it could lead to cancers.



Each September, the HPV National **Immunisation Programme offers** vaccination to all boys and girls in first year of secondary school. **HPV** immunisation is most effective before a person becomes sexually active.
